Bellaire Season Highlights: Bellaire ended the season with an 18-5 record, the most wins in program history. They were 12-0 in district for a second consecutive year, and were district champions for the 5th straight time. They have scored 118 goals (5.13 per game) and given up just 21 (0.91 per game). In district play, they outscored opponents this season 97-3. In non-district play, Bellaire went 6-5 against a very tough schedule, including wins over CFISD playoff teams Cy Woods and Cy Ranch, as well as state-ranked Pearland. The team is led by senior captain and 4-year starter, Allie Schachter. Schachter has 88 points on the season (30 goals, 28 assists), and has scored 100 goals in her career. Juniors Jasmin Garzon and Alex Couvillon have also been instrumental to the Cardinals' offensive success. Garzon has 55 points (17 goals, 21 assists), and Couvillon has 36 points (16 goals, 4 assists). Defensively, senior captains Charlotte Ehlers and Elidaisy Ortuno, along with senior Ariana Cruz and sophomore Demi Pappas have anchored the back line and have 12 shutouts on the season.

First, The Woodlands Invitational where they went 2-0-1, and then the Katy 1-10 Shootout where the Lobos reached the championship match of their bracket and came up just short in penalty kicks. The Lobos finished their regular season with a record of 14-4-5 and a District 17-AAAAAA record of 8-2-3. In District, the Lobos allowed the second fewest amount of goals all season (10), this was due to the great defensive leadership on the back line lead by Captains Sarah Montalvo and Erin Kelley. The midfield was controlled by Sophomore Standout Deena Cuatete who distributed the ball well. On the attacking side, the Lobos had quite a few players at their disposal.
