## Team Notes

**Bellaire Season Highlights:** 2-0 win over Langham Creek in Bi-District Round.

Bellaire ended the season with an 18-5 record, the most wins in program history. They were 12-0 in district for a second consecutive year, and were district champions for the 5th straight time. They scored 118 goals (5.13 per game) and gave up just 21 (0.91 per game). In district play, they outscored opponents this season 97-3. In non-district play, Bellaire went 6-5 against a very tough schedule, including wins over CFISD playoff teams Cy Woods and Cy Ranch, as well as state-ranked Pearland. The team is led by senior captain and 4-year starter, Allie Schachter. Schachter had 88 points on the season (30 goals, 28 assists), and has scored 100 goals in her career. Juniors Jasmin Garzon and Alex Couvillon have also been instrumental to the Cardinals' offensive success. Garzon had 55 points (17 goals, 21 assists), and Couvillon had 36 points (16 goals, 4 assists). Sophomore Laila Saravia is a highly-skilled player who bridges the gap between the offense and defense at the holding midfield position. Defensively, senior captains Charlotte Ehlers and Elidaisy Ortuno, along with senior Ariana Cruz and sophomore Demi Pappas anchored the back line and had 12 shutouts on the season.

### “Coach Shipman on Bellaire”

Coach Shipman on Bellaire: Coach Thompson has turned Bellaire into a serious contender. The preparation, energy, and commitment that Coach Thompson and his staff bring to every game is a huge part of the success Bellaire has had. This is a team that does not back down and plays extremely hard. Allie Schachter is a tremendous player who can take over a game single handedly, and the tenacious work rate of Bellaire's midfield with Jasmin Garzon and Elidaisy Ortuno is impressive and not something to be overlooked. Center Back Demi Pappas is a big time player in the back that has been an impressive defender all year. This second round match up against the Cardinals will be a true test for Tompkins.

**Tompkins Season Highlights:** Placing second in a very competitive district 19-6A with a record of 10-1-1, and an overall record of 16-2-3. This is their third consecutive playoff appearance.

Player highlights include forward Skylar Parker (51 points) and outside midfielder Leanne Veary (30 points) who have led the way on the offensive end while Kayla Ruopp, Lauryn Wild and Kati Shaposhnikov have powered the central midfield. Freshmen Avery Burchett, Terin Graham, Sophie Wolf, Valeria Gomez, and in goal Sydney Craig have provided outstanding defense only giving up 9 goals in 20 games. Seniors Veruzka Gomez, Maria Benavides, and Seanna McCarty have provided a real spark for this team his year as well. Barbara Olivieri has just returned from playing with the U-17 Venezuelan national team in a bid to qualify for the U-17 World Cup, and we are glad to have her back.

### “Coach Thompson on Tompkins”

“We have as much respect for the Tompkins program as any program in the state. Their senior class is phenomenal. I think Veary is one of, if not the most, underrated player in the region. Her work rate on the wing is just really impressive. A relentless worker. Craig probably doesn't get enough credit for switching positions for her senior year and going to keeper. A very unselfish move. She is assertive, tough, and an obvious leader. Ruopp has an incredibly high soccer IQ, and always seems to be in the right place making the right pass. A prime example of a team-first player. Certainly Olivieri will be a challenge for us to contain. She is a special player, and completely fearless. Her passion for the game and for her teammates is evident. Having Parker up top also playing as well as she has all season gives Tompkins as potent an offensive attack as there is in the state. Coach Shipman has done a remarkable job keeping this team motivated and not taking games or wins for granted. He seems to do an excellent job in knowing which buttons to push at the right time to keep this team humble, hungry, and playing their best when it matters most.
